## **RUNS A PLENTY AS THE ROAD TO THE LITTLE LEAGUE WORLD SERIES CONTINUES**

The "Road to the Little League World Series" in Williamsport, Pa. continued on Saturday with second round games in Oakville for the Little League Ontario District 1 Major Championship.

In the first game of the day, held in Oakville, High Park routed Dundas 25-0 in four innings. For High Park, Craig Ogaki went three innings striking out five batters and only allowed one walk in the win. In the second inning, High Park scored 24 times, four of those runs came when Adriane Anlacan hit a grand slam.

The next game saw Oakville overpower Erindale 10-0 in four innings. At the plate for Oakville, Matt Des Vigres and Greg Barbuto each had two singles and two RBIs. Lee Joch also had two RBIs but on one single. For Erindale, Ryan Storey had the only hit of the game for his team. On the mound for Oakville, Rob Cant went four innings allowing one hit and striking out six Erindale batters.

The final game of the day was between Stoney Creek and Ancaster. Ancaster took an early four run lead after the first inning and didn't look back as they defeated Stoney Creek 5-3. Jacob Hanes took the loss for Stoney Creek going five innings on the mound allowing three earned runs on six hits and also struck out three batters. At the plate Danny Davis had a triple while his teammate Eric Mignardi had two singles. For Stoney Creek, Matthew Frketch had two singles in the loss.

The tournament continues on Sunday in Dundas with the first game going at 11 AM.

Teams will play five round robin games with the top four teams advancing on to the semi-finals. The semi-final winners will move on to the Championship game on Thursday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7 PM, hosted by Erindale Lions Little League at Springfield Park in Mississauga.

The District 1 Champions will move on to the Little League Ontario Championship in Pembroke, Ontario hosted by Pembroke and Petawawa Little League. The Little League Ontario Champions will continue on to the Canadian Little League Championship in Val D'Or, Quebec with the winner advancing to the Little League World Series. The High Park Braves enters this year's District tournament as defending district champions.

Eleven divisions of play in Little League Baseball and Little League Softball culminate in World Series tournaments. In a 45-day period, more than 30,000 tournament games are played in more than 100 countries.
